Some can be only minor—You start the day with a dead car battery; A meeting runs longer than planned; You hit every red light on the parkway; The doorbell rings just as you rolled the first swipe of paint on the wall; and so on. Some interruptions can be life-changing—Perhaps your job position was eliminated; You didn't get into the college program you were working towards; Maybe you've received a phone call with news that in an instant, changed life as you know it.

Interruptions can be seen as an inconvenience, or seen as an opportunity. And how we handle them can not only affect us, but can affect others!


An unplanned pregnancy can be an interruption in the life of a client. And how it is viewed and handled, most definitely has its affects. At HPC, we see this first hand. Clients have dropped out of school, not working, and living off of whatever public aid they can; some are kicked out of the home, be it of parents or boyfriend, now couch surfing between friends; many fathers do not marry, leaving them with little or no support. For some, this is a cycle continued from the previous generation. At HPC we believe that God is leading us to do something about it. With our HOPE Program, our Client Coaches can help clients capture a vision for their life, create a customized plan with attainable goals, and celebrate with them, one accomplishment at a time. With this in place, the interruption of inconvenience, now offers an opportunity with an outcome for a different life empowered to overcome whatever obstacles are in their way, so they can finish

High school, pursue college, secure jobs, become independent, and raise their children in stable, healthy homes breaking generational cycles and having less repeat unplanned pregnancies.

We often think of our clients as the ones needing to change their view and how they handle "interruptions". And while that's true, I have been reminded that I, too, need to view the interruptions that come my way, in the same manner, placing my trust and hope in the hands of a God who gives us endless opportunities.



At Hope Pregnancy Center, 2017 was without a doubt, a year of "building"... From brick and mortar- we now have a beautiful and strong exterior wall; From interior renovations- we now have a medical floor, offices, and the HOPE Store. From familiar faces to new faces- we have staff and volunteers who serve this ministry with their talents, time, and big hearts! Yet, the reason that we can celebrate 2017 and anticipate 2018, is because our mission remains the same— to build hope and strengthen families, one at a time! We celebrate the lives that have been saved and changed over this past year. As you can see from the chart below, the Center stats are building. We were thrilled to see the number of new clients increase, along with the number of client visits. While HPC is only open 3 days/week, we still served 364 client visits in 2017, which kept the staff and volunteers very busy! As we step into this new year to serve our repeat clients and to reach new clients in our HOPE program, we anticipate the opportunity to serve the community by continuing to offer pregnancy tests, along with the ability to offer ultrasounds.

She and her husband recently blessed us with our first grandchild, Annabelle Grace. They farm; rice, wheat, and soy beans in Arkansas. In 1997 we welcomed our son, Mason. He is currently majoring in both Political Science and Cultural/Geospatial Studies at Arkansas Tech University. My husband's employer, NRG Energy, brought us to Illinois a year ago. We are currently remodeling a 125 year old farmhouse in Emington.

I have long had a strong passion for ministering to women. After serving in women's ministry, mentoring moms of young children, mentoring homeschool moms, and working behind the scenes of a new pregnancy help center in Hamburg, New York. I am so blessed to have an opportunity to serve the women of Hope Pregnancy Center.
